All interested aviation professionals and students are welcome, as are professionals from outside aviation but interested in human factors and safety issues.

INTRODUCTION BY THE PRESIDENT OF EAAP

The Sky is Not the limit

The saying 'the sky is the limit' used to indicate our optimism about endless possibilities for growth and expansion. And aviation succeeded wonderfully. Air travel is for everybody. But the infrastructure of air traffic has now become our limit, and a frustrating one indeed.

Limited capacity of airways, slots and airplane movements on airports are not always directly related to a lack of space but to the way we use our infrastructure. Nobody wants to collide with other aircraft at any time. So, we used to simply fly behind each other with long intervals (procedural control). Next, Radar allowed someone on the ground to see the aircraft around, so intervals could be reduced a bit. Countries are now covered with blankets of radar control that pass aircraft amongst each other, requiring coordination and communication, thus adding more bottlenecks limiting us!

Beating the barriers

SESAR and NextGen are international projects of considerable size aimed at increasing capacity for aviation. The communication barrier has to be beaten technically by implementing air-ground data link (Email in the cockpit and ATC) and replacing the old phones for controllers by internet-like networks also enabling so-called advanced planning. That is planning by means of free data shared among many parties about weather, company planning etc. Sharing such data in the open is an important psychological step for companies and organisations. Sharing and combining sections of air space into a big and more usable area is a political challenge.

Building the next step

Airways are virtual roads imposing 2D limits on travel. But there is ample space to fly in, so the Free Flight idea was introduced, pilots can use Automatic Dependent Surveillance-Broadcast(ADS-B) and see other aircraft around them. Use all available space! Trajectory based 4D operations shall allow airlines to plan and fly the routes when and where they want it. Pilots will share the burden of separation with the ground and advanced computer tools will hopefully make all the work manageable.

Psychology of (lack of) change

There is a 'natural' resistance to change and leadership is required to implement any. Enormous challenges are ahead of us. Not only developing but especially implementing new technology and operations is now becoming the issue. We have to think about effective and affordable training and re-training of thousands of pilots and Air Traffic Controllers.

Making it happen is (y)our challenge

Our conference theme is: facilitating change(s). Psychology comes into play now. Without psychology nothing will happen or only very slowly. How can we assure that politicians will finally agree and allow a single sky over Europe? What will future technologies bring for our pilots, cabin crew, controllers, baggage handlers, mechanics? Can we have the benefits quick please? We need them!

Our keynote speakers are well informed about the possible future to come and will enlighten us about the effects of technology (Flight deck and ATC) on the work for human beings. They will also present us a picture of possible ways to deal with all that safely.

When preparing your abstract please keep in mind:

- The EAAP scientific committee will use your abstract for evaluating your submission and decide whether it will be approved for the conference program.
- Once accepted, your abstract will be printed in the EAAP31 Conference 'Book of Abstracts' as submitted. The BoA includes the conference program and the abstracts should help participants decide which sessions to attend during the conference.
- Workshops offered should involve audience involvement and interaction!

EAAP31 will once again provide poster presenters with the attention they deserve by organising a **Best Poster Competition.**

Authors will be notified of the acceptance of their presentation or workshop by **April 18, 2014**.

SUBMISSION OF FULL PAPERS

Authors of whom the papers or posters have been accepted for presentation at the conference should submit the full text of their paper or poster online by August 29, 2014 latest.
