As in previous years, the theme for the 4th Symposium is "Contemporary Issues in Aviation" to encourage participation from a wider spectrum of disciplines in aviation.

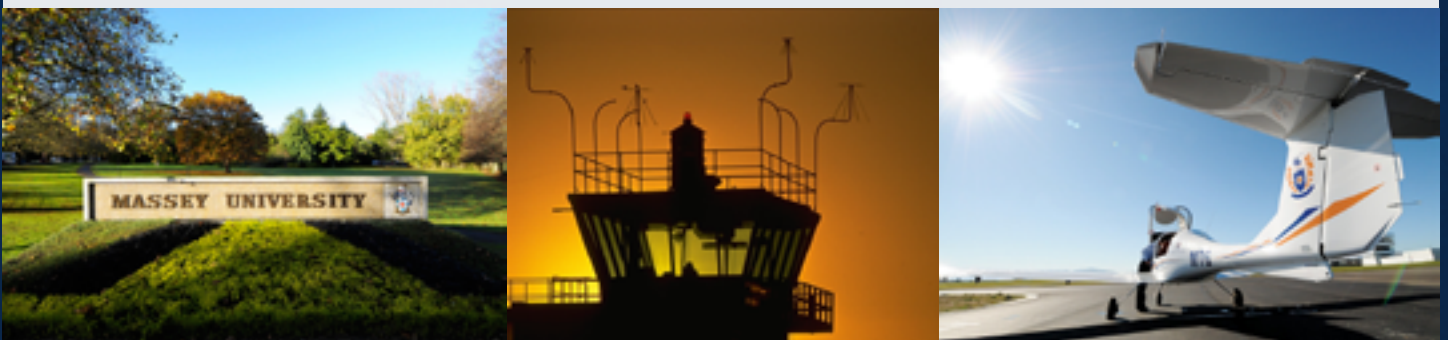
